## Analyse the following passage from Herman Melville's "Benito Cereno":

"What, pray, was Atufal's offense, Don Benito? [...] from contagion" (Melville 51)

Please analyse this text, addressing the following tasks and questions. Refer to the categories presented on the narratology handout. You may write up to *three* pages of text, according to the formatting specifications of our style sheet. Any text beyond the first three pages will be ignored. Also, there will be a deduction of at least 10% if your paper does not conform to the style sheet.

# 1. Focalisation and Narration (30 points)

- (a) Identify and categorise the narrator according to the typology of narrators (i.e. to the narrative level, the extent of participation, the degree of perceptibility and the question of reliability).
- (b) Identify the focaliser(s) and comment on the shifts in focalisation in the given passage. What effects result from these shifts?

### 2. Characterisation (40 points)

Applying the different techniques of characterisation, what do you find out about:

- (a) Delano?
- (b) Benito Cereno?
- (c) Babo?

On this basis:

(d) Comment on the relationship between the characters and support your statement with your findings on narration and focalisation.

### 3. Wider Context (30 points)

- (a) Name **one other passage** in the novel which corresponds or contrasts with this passage in **one particular aspect**.
- (b) Describe the nature and significance of the correspondence or contrast.
- (c) Relate both passages to one of the central themes of the novel.
